### Loving others without losing yourself

There are tensions – even paradoxes – in the world of the helping professions. We are simultaneously giving blood transfusions of hope and health, whilst seeking to stay alive ourselves. There is an emptying out in service to others, and the need to function in sustainable ways. How do we manage this tension as supervisors and frontline carers? How can we go beyond the minimum of staying alive; how can we thrive as we integrate working hard and living well?

**Session 1: Supervisor focus:** Exploration of key dimensions of this paradox; risk and protective factors in the supervisory role; and ways to use energy in restorable ways.

**Session 2: Supervisee focus:** Recognising signs in our supervisees that indicate who might be struggling to get the balance right as they seek to love others without losing themselves.

### Academic & Professional Publishing: a Step by Step Guide

This session will present a step-by-step guide to the world of academic and professional publishing. The focus will be on publishing in academic journals, and will discuss practical steps at each stage of the process (choosing a journal, preparing and submitting a paper, the peer review and editing process). There will also be a brief discussion about other forms of disseminating your work, such as books, presentations, and online formats.

### Exploring Themes in Educating and Supervising Pastoral Carers: a Live Consultation
